#### **Misconception #3:**

- Our View of Disability Doesn't Matter
  - How we are superior to one another (Deficit perspective)
  - How we value each other (Culturally perspective)
  - How we treat each other (Sociological perspective)

#### **Misconception #4:**

- "Good Teaching" Will Solve the Problem
  - o <u>How</u> we teach matters more than <u>what</u> we teach
  - Embrace a wide instructional tolerance
  - Use assessment to inform instruction


