



REPRESENTATION MATTERS

Latino children are the fastest-growing segment of the U.S. school population, yet only 8% of teachers, 4% of board members, and 2% of senior education leaders are Latino. Thus, the majority of Latino Catholic school children, may never be instructed or led by a Latina/o teacher, principal, or administrator.

Research shows that representation matters, and Latino leadership is essential.

A shared student and teacher identity (home language, ethnicity, background knowledge, lived experiences, etc.) can lead to improved academic outcomes (Dixon, 2017). Additionally, "by exposing Latino children to more leaders who look like them, it helps them imagine what they want to become and can reinforce strong self-efficacy around the value of their identities and *Latinidad*. It's been said 'you can't be what you can't see." (Fernandez, 2018).

AMPLIFYING LATINO VOICES

The Alliance for Catholic Education and the National Catholic Educational Association (NCEA) partnered to establish the **Latino Educator and Administrator Development (LEAD)** in July 2020. Our aim was to develop a program that amplifies Latino voices in the classroom, at the school level, and beyond. The year-long program is designed to form, advance, and retain Latino educators in Catholic education by providing professional development and community mentorship rooted in Catholic faith. Since July 2020, over 150 Latino educators have been mentored through LEAD.

As a Latina educator, words cannot express my gratitude for this life-changing experience. This journey has filled me with resilience and an unwavering commitment to uplift my school community both inside and outside of the classroom. I am beyond blessed to have connected with such inspiring individuals and gained valuable insights at Notre Dame. This is only the beginning of my journey as an educator!

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The LEAD program consists of a **one-year fellowship** experience centered around:

- > SPIRITUALITY through a retreat atmosphere
- COMMUNITY via networking
- ▶ **PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT** through presentations and workshops

The fellowship includes a **mid-year retreat** and culminates in a **3-day conference** on campus at the University of Notre Dame. Fellowship teams, facilitated by a mentor, will work through a series of modules made available online each month.

COST: \$700

Includes the summer conference, mid-year retreat, a mentor, and year-long fellowship experience. Scholarships are available and Title funds may be used to cover the cost of the program.
